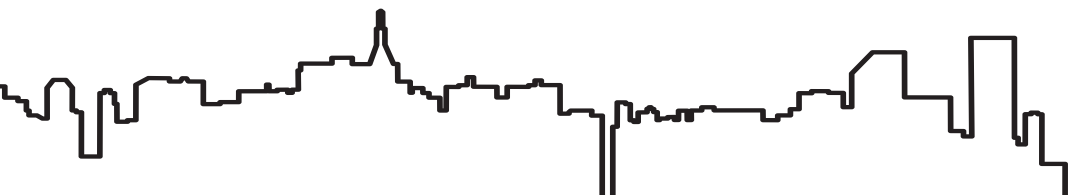
URBAN OCTOBER - LIFE IN THE CITY

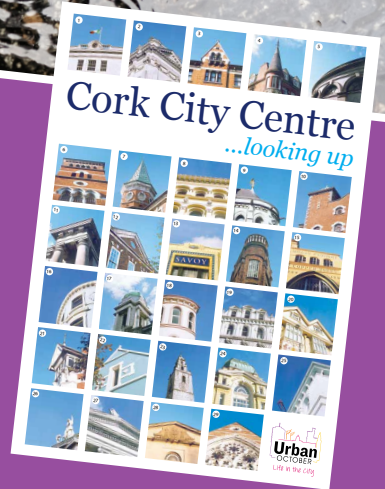

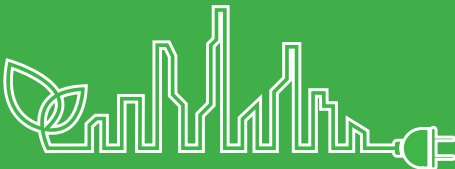
