'Ground Floor'





An exhibition by Third Year Fine Art and Ceramics students of CIT Crawford College of Art & Design, opens to public viewing from $2^{nd} - 16^{th}$ June. It will provide a diverse approach to art during the midsummer exhibition and arts circuit, through the utilisation of a non-art space, The Elysian.

After 3 years of study in the Crawford, the 57 students have developed their knowledge and techniques, applying a wide variety of approaches to Fine Art and Ceramics. The group's work is diverse, using mediums such as printmaking, painting, film & photography, textiles, installation, sculpture and more. The students have developed a strong and panoramic conceptual base as diverse as the artists themselves.

The exhibition space was sourced and secured by the students. They found it to be a space that could accommodate ambitious creative interventions within a non-traditional art setting. The name 'Ground Floor' was born out of a visit to the exhibition space in its raw state, inspired by it setting beneath the tower above.
