## **Travelling to Cork**

**Cork Airport** is Ireland's second busiest airport and is located just 8 km from Cork City Centre. Cork Airport has direct air connections to over 50 destinations across Europe and to North America. Cork has daily links to key hub airports like London (Heathrow and Gatwick), Amsterdam (Schiphol) and Paris (Charles de Gaulle). Connectivity via London is particularly strong with an average of 8 daily flights from London (Heathrow, Gatwick and Stansted airports) into Cork (journey time approx 1 hour), making Cork an easily accessible location. Other international airports in Ireland include:

- **Dublin Airport** -located 270 km from Cork City Centre. Journey time from Dublin Airport to Cork City is approximately 3.5 hours. For further information about flights to Dublin see www.dublinairport.com
